Did you know that our bones are constantly being 'torn down' and 'built back up'? Osteoporosis is a condition where our bones get porous and weak so they break easily. Osteoclasts are cells that tear down old bone and osteoblasts are cells that build new bone. Osteoporosis happens whenever the osteoclasts work harder than the osteoblasts. Adequate calcium is

needed for strong bones, but weight-bearing exercise is essential to stimulate osteoblasts to make new bone. Walking, modest weight lifting, and resistance exercise all help build bone. Actually, weight-bearing exercise can do more for osteoporosis than calcium supplements alone. Eat healthy and get regular exercise to keep your bones 'all built up'!


