

Dr Kelly's Health Nugget



Science has discovered that our brains are not hard-wired like we thought they were but are quite plastic. It turns out that our brain is constantly re-wiring itself! Brain mapping reveals the wiring changes in days to weeks. Before surgical correction of syndactyly (fused digits) the brain map shows only 4 digits, but within days to weeks after surgery the map shows all 5 digits. Complete recovery from a stroke is now known to be 100% possible with sufficient,

prolonged stimulation of the affected limbs. Recovery of full function has been documented after more than a decade of flaccid paralysis. Neuroplasticity is changing not just our brains but how we do stroke rehabilitation. (See "The Brain That Changes Itself," by Norman Doidge, MD)

A slushy mix of water and snow was used for mortar while and the other hand clasp the frozen brick waiting for the temperature hovering around 10° and the wind whipping and whistling about to freeze the structure in place. It took several hours to complete the sanctuary - complete with two compartments, the Ark of the Covenant, the seven-branched candlestick, altar of incense,

and table of showbread, as well as the laver and altar of burnt offering outside of the igloo sanctuary. Hale says that ultimately it is "a fun exercise to do with the kids in working together and completing a project."

Teacher Janna Wright and students Tandish and Ebnay Kuzvuinswa, Fortune and Fortunate Majada, Autumn Hale, Zack Sarge, Kolter, Boen, Roper and Hazy Karges rotated in and out of the school/church building warming up their fingers and toes!


