Sight and Seeing

Sight is such a vital sense. When I first got glasses, I was told that my vision was sufficient enough to notice the kid running into the street - but not the ball he was chasing. Years later, I got to the point where I couldn't read my sermon notes with my glasses on but couldn't read the monitor display with my glasses off. Because of this, I now wear bifocals.



Sight and seeing are not the same thing. Most people can walk into a room but will not see the same thing. I believe we are facing this issue regarding our school, Dakota Adventist Academy.

I want to be very transparent with each of you. First, I am a firm believer in the value of Christian Education. I also realize that times have changed. When my wife and I were attending academy, the average family size was larger and academy attendance was not an option. That is no longer our reality. Families today are smaller and attending an academy is a decision given to the child. This does not mean that the Academy is no longer valuable.

Second, I strongly believe that we need to do everything in our power to both highlight the positives and address the challenges. Winston Churchill has been attributed to have said, "A lie can travel halfway around the world before the truth can get its boots on." I am going to add my own rendering of that statement, Dakota style, "A rumor can travel to the Black Hills and back before the truth gets off the farm." Will the Academy be open next year? Without any question in my mind, the answer is "YES!" Will it be open 10 years from now? I cannot see that far ahead, but I can assure each of you that we hold that decision in our hands.

A self-fulfilling prophecy is an individual's expectations coming to fruition. For instance, if we don't believe that our school has benefit for our kids, then we are contributing to its demise. If we believe that donations to the Academy are a waste and we decide to no longer give, we are contributing to its demise. The opposite is also true. If you believe the Academy is a place where our kids will receive a good education, connections with other Christian students, where faith is a priority, where teachers and staff speak values into the lives of our young people, where service and sharing are essential values that are espoused and exemplified - then we will be contributing to its success. I could go on, but I am keenly aware that what we look for, we typically find.

We are working hard to place Dakota Adventist Academy on the most solid footing we can. As a Conference, we give almost 10% of our entire annual budget to support the school. The Academy continues to have generous people who give in ways that humble us and cause us to simply offer prayers of thanksgiving.

I want to see more than challenges; I want to see the opportunities and the potential. Yes, we need funds. Yes, we need students. But what we really need is to see what COULD be.

I remember the story of a boy who wanted to humble a wise man. The boy boasted of his ability to outsmart the man with a riddle. He approached the wise man and asked a simple question, "Is the bird in my hands alive or dead?" Whatever answer was given, the boy planned to produce evidence to the contrary. The man's answer was both simple and profound. He quietly said, "The answer is in your hands."

The answer to our reality is in our hands as well.

Annual Fund Goal

\$275,000 / year

Gifts to the Annual Fund are unrestricted donations that are valuable to the operation of the school. They contribute to the stability and security of the school program and are applied where the need is greatest.

Worthy Student Fund Goal

\$125,000 / year

These gifts go to work immediately in assisting students with financial needs. Approximately half of our students currently receive assistance from this fund. Support is needed annually, especially in these financially difficult times.

Dorm Renovation Goal \$80,000 / year

Our students spend many hours in their dorm rooms throughout the school year. It is their home away from home. Here they study, sleep, relax, and spend personal time in worship. In addition, the dorms are used during Alumni Weekend, Campmeeting, and other special events.

Non-cash Gifts

Donations of shares of stock, land, and crops are just a few ideas for non-cash donations.

Legacy Gifts

Cifts left in the form of a legacy through your estate plans play a vital part in the operation of DAA.
